Iris Fisher Scholarship

Scholarship History

The scholarship is named after Iris Fisher, an important founding member of the Pakuranga Arts Society and driving force behind the creation of the Fisher Gallery, later to become Te Tuhi. Her original bequest has fostered and encouraged contemporary visual art practice and in particular arts education. The Iris Fisher Scholarship, therefore, has been created to encourage and assist an excellent postgraduate visual art student with their studies.

The Scholarship has been in existence since 2007 and has supported the artists Erica van Zon, Boris Dornbusch, Jeremy Leatinu'u, Anthony Cribb, Louise Menzies, Blaine Western, Charlotte Drayton, Kalisolaite 'Uhila, Katrina Beekhuis, Hannah Valentine, Christina Pataialii and Quishile Charan.

The Scholarship is open to full and part-time applicants from across New Zealand.

The Scholarship

The Iris Fisher Scholarship is awarded to one recipient annually. In 2019, the award will be for \$5,000 and will be payable in one lump sum. It is envisaged that these funds will be put toward fees, materials, travel or a purpose which will enable and aid the recipient to successfully complete their final year of tertiary study.

After completion of their study the successful applicant will then be invited to submit an exhibition proposal to Te Tuhi for consideration.

Eligibility

The scholarship is to support a student enrolled in a visual arts/ fine arts course of study at tertiary level, which meets all the following requirements:

- a. Applicants must be in their final year of a postgraduate course of study at a New Zealand university. This must be either a 4th year level 700 Honours, Postgraduate Diploma or a Masters – both full or part-time students are accepted.
- b. Applicants must provide certified proof of their current postgraduate enrolment status.
- c. A postgraduate course of study is a tertiary level qualification awarded by a tertiary education commission accredited institution.
- d. Applications should arrive no later than 5pm, Monday 12 August 2019.
- e. The Iris Fisher Scholarship is not available to any person who has an employment contract with Te Tuhi.

Selection Process

Applications will be assessed by Te Tuhi staff and the successful applicant will be publicly announced at the opening event of Te Tuhi's exhibitions on Saturday 31 August 2019.
